POLICE VEHICLE EQUIPMENT

In light of recent events regarding police vehicles and the issues our officers have had with prisoners who are placed in them, Chief Shockey presented council with 3 pieces of equipment he would like to purchase. The first is an anti-theft device. The total cost of this device is \$2616 and since the installation would be done at the city's garage, there would be no additional cost. The second piece of equipment is a half-cage partition and would be placed in the 13 police vehicles that transport prisoners. This equipment is under state contract and the total cost, including installation and labor will be \$37,349. This partition will deny the prisoner full access to the back seat, making it nearly impossible for them to be able to wrestle themselves out of handcuffs and will also enable the officer to seatbelt the prisoner without having to reach across them. The third piece of equipment is a gun mount system. This is needed in the previously mentioned 13 vehicles, as the new half cage configuration will not work with the gun mount system currently in those vehicles. The total cost of this equipment will be \$5096. The total cost for all equipment additions will be \$59,363.

LEINICKE GROUP

Craig and Connie Leinicke from The Leinicke Group along with Jeff Dunlap presented council with an update of their progress in regards to the City's website and social media presence. Since the website launched in 2015 it has grown from 7,000 annual visitors to 50,000 visitors per month. This is an increase of 850%. The site has had 1.6 million views in the last three years. There are currently 1286 documents and 377 pages on the site and over 3600 subscribers. They are adding content and updating daily, along with handling special projects and video productions for the city. They also presented council with their ideas for future endeavors.

CEDARHURST OF ARNOLD ASSISTED LIVING AND MEMORY CARE

Bryan Richison informed council that this special meeting was being held to determine the council's interest in approving the use of either Chapter 100 Bonds or Chapter 353 Tax Abatement for the Cedarhurst Assisted Living and Memory Care project and to answer any questions the council may have regarding this issue.

Mark Grimm with Gilmore Bell was in attendance and informed council of the difference between the two options and answered any questions they had.

Jordan Dorsey with Dover Development stated their company did not have a strong preference either way on which they would like to see used; either Chapter 100 Bonds or Chapter 353 Tax Abatement as either would offer them roughly the same monetary value. Mr. Dorsey stated they are currently waiting on a study from their engineer and would hope to break ground in March. As they stated in the previous Work Session, they are seeking 50% tax abatement on personal property tax over the next 20 years along with sales tax exemption on construction materials.

Bob Sweeney stated he does not suggest using Chapter 353 due to the fact that we must be able to prove social blight in order to use it and he does not believe the property qualifies as such.

Questions and comments followed by council.

Mayor Counts polled council asking the question, "Is the council interested in moving forward with the use of Chapter 100 Bonds." The poll resulted in an answer of no.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 210.080 (KEEPING OF WILD ANIMALS) OF THE CITY CODE.

WHEREAS, currently the City Code prohibits the keeping of any animals defined as "wild animals"; and

WHEREAS, some animals defined as "wild animals" can be kept safely without threat to public health; and

WHEREAS, a permit process is needed to identify and allow the keeping of "wild animals" that do not pose a health risk;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARNOLD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Article I, Section 210.080 Keeping of Wild Animals of the City Code is amended as follows: The current subsection B is deleted.

Section 2. A new subsection B is adopted as follows:

"B. No person shall keep or permit to be kept any wild animal as a pet without a special permit.

- 1. Applications for a wild animal permit shall be submitted to the Community Development Department in a form and format stipulated by the Department and shall include the identification of the specific wild animal for which the permit is sought and the specific location at which the wild animal will be housed.
- 2. The Community Development Director will evaluate the application using the following criteria:
 - a. The applicant can provide a sanitary, safe area for the wild animal to be kept in a humane condition.
 - b. The wild animal is not of a breed or species that makes frequent loud noises or emits any kind of odor that would be a nuisance to the surrounding neighborhood.
 - c. The wild animal is not of a breed or species that is known to carry communicable diseases that can transfer to humans in a manner that would create a public health hazard.
 - d. The wild animal is not poisonous.
 - e. The wild animal does not produce any kind of toxic odor or substance.
 - f. The wild animal is not a carnivorous predator in its natural state in the wild.
 - g. The wild animal does not have any traits or characteristics that would endanger the public or cause a public health hazard.

- h. Applicant shall provide proof of insurance coverage for the wild animal.
- 3. After reviewing the application and gathering any necessary information, the Community Development Director will notify the applicant of the permit's approval or denial.
- 4. Permits are only for the specific wild animal at the specific location. If the location of the animal is changed a new permit will be required. If the wild animal dies or otherwise ceases being housed at the location, any replacement wild animal, even of the same breed or species, will require a new permit. Any additional wild animal kept, even of the same breed or species of wild animal that already has a permit, will require an individual permit.
- 5. If a permit is denied by the Community Development Director the applicant has ten (10) business days after receiving notification of the denial to appeal to the City Administrator. The City Administrator's decision is final."




